Algebra II Syllabus

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Course Description: Algebra II addresses the advanced components of the algebra standards. Topics include linear, exponential, polynomial and quadratic functions, radical and rational functions, trigonometric functions and identities, sequences and series, and probability and statistics. This year we will also do a geometry unit.

Textbook and Online Resources: The Holt Algebra II book will be used for this course. The textbook will also be available to each student online and via a CD-ROM. There are a variety of resources online including homework help, lesson tutorial videos, a multilingual glossary, interactive practice tests, and parent resources.

Grades: Quarter grades are based on in-class activities, assignments, and assessments. All assignments are due the following day at the beginning of the hour.
